


ISO Configuration Guide Multi-user CD disk access through Virtual CD drives


This is a brief walkthrough on how to create and mount an ISO using MagicDisc (a free, feature limited version of the MagicISO software.) This walkthrough assumes that you have already installed MagicDisc using all default installation options. It is intended for the purposes of using a virtual CD drive to allow access for multiple users to a single CD/DVD resource.

Create an ISO


1. Right click on the MagicDisc icon in the system tray



2. Select the option "Make CD/DVD Image"



3. Select the CD/DVD drive that you are making the ISO from. Verify that the CD/DVD is in the drive before continuing! There are several image types to select from. ISO is recommended due to its popularity and widespread use. When finished selecting file type and destination, click Ok.




Mount an ISO


1. Right-click on the MagicDisc icon in the system tray, and select "Virtual CD/DVD-ROM", then select the virtual CD drive you wish to use on the breakout menu, and then select "Mount" on the subsequent breakout menu.



2. Select the image you wish to mount and click Ok.



3. The drive should now have the appropriate image mounted on it.





Conclusion

Now, multiple different users on this PC can simultaneously access the G: "DVD" (virtual) drive from their "My Computer" window as if it was their own individual physical drive. Applications will also have simultaneous access to the drive.
